Current Situation

- Hundreds of thousands left homeless
- Many dead due to drowning and electrocution
- Hundreds believed to be trapped in homes
- Electricity and water supplies cut off
- Heavy rains expected to continue threatening even more flooding
- People are spending several days in the same damp, dirty clothes increasing their chances of illness and disease
- High risk for disease and illness such as: typhoid, malaria, dengue fever, bird flu, virus, diarrhea, skin diseases, respiratory problems, and exposure

Indonesia Floods

On February 2, 2007, crisis again hit Indonesia. Torrential rains have caused rivers to rise and submerge much of Jakarta under water. Over 300,000 people in the Indonesian capital are affected and many have died, while the survivors are at high risk for disease due to filthy flood waters.
