



Disaster Preparedness Team



Mission

To provide leadership and encourage community members to acquire disaster preparedness training to protect and plan for one's self, family and neighbors in the event that a disaster should strike

To prepare volunteers who can respond and mobilize on short notice in times of emergency to help those affected by disaster wherever it may be necessary



Disaster Preparedness Team

- Learning lessons from Hurricane Katrina, Hidaya initiated the Disaster Preparedness Team project to do our part in making sure as many of our community members become trained as possible
- Hidaya's staff has completed training
- Community members are being trained throughout the Bay Area.
- Austin, TX and other communities are considering to mobilize this training
- Project is scalable to national and international level

Become a part of your community's response team -20 hour CERT training

Level III

Become a part of community as well as an international response team -20 hour CERT training plus EMT training class

Roads are closed/clogged with traffic
How and where do we take shelter?
How do we get food?
How do we treat the injured and sick?
How do we meet the needs of children?
How do we arrange for lavatories?
How do we arrange for security?
How can we help our surrounding neighbors?



"Planning and Managing" Before and During Disaster Time

Make Facilities Earthquake Damage Safe

Community leadership must be trained to at least level II

Train male & female community members for every community

Level I – 50% of the community Level II – 5% of the community Level III – 1% of the community



"Planning and Managing" Before and During Disaster Time

- Massive Drive among community members for assembling Disaster Preparedness Kits
- Enough supplies ready to take care of hundreds of people for at least 7 days
- Plan for accommodating Injured decide where to set up, who can manage, tools ready for managing



"Planning and Managing" Before and During Disaster Time

Planning/Execution Team for Disaster Preparedness is needed


Keep in contact with trained members in the community

Plan and seek advice from Experts
